# What St Mary's offers

St Mary's School & College provides residential and non-residential education, care and therapy for pupils aged 7-19. Our pupils have speech, language and communication needs and may also have associated physical and learning difficulties.

Our therapy, health and wellbeing teams and on-site facilities enable us to deliver provision across the waking curriculum. Our model of integrated therapy means that the pupils' needs are planned, provided, and assessed in natural and functional settings. There is the opportunity to develop high levels of trust and familiarity leading to strong therapeutic relationships. Skills are addressed in the clusters which serve functions in the pupils' life maximising independence levels, and the development of 'tools for life'.

The ultimate aim is for every pupil to achieve as much independence as possible so that they can live a fulfilled life.

# AAC

## What is AAC?

Augmentative and Alternative Communication (**AAC**) describes a wide range of techniques pupils can use to support spoken communication. These include gesture, signing, symbols, word boards, communication boards and books, as well as Voice Output Communication Aids (VOCAs).



**At St Mary's** the use of AAC is supported across the waking curriculum. We have Speech and Language Therapists with specialist skills and interests in this area. We also have an AAC Practitioner onsite who offers technical support, training and programming to pupils, staff and carers.

**Low-tech aids** are AAC systems which do not need a battery to work. They may include everyday objects, communication books with pictures, symbols or photos, alphabet charts and even pen and paper.

**High-tech aids** need a battery to work and cover a variety of AAC systems.



High-tech aids enable the pupil to make choices and create messages using pictures, symbols, words or letters that can be linked to an electronic voice.
